The meeting, held in the high school cafeteria, began at 7:05pm and ended at 8:00.

I. Financial Review

- A. The CKC still owes \$5,000 for the new turf field.
- B. Ending balance as of 9/27/06: \$8,350.27
- C. The CKC contributed approximately \$1,000 for new varsity soccer bags and \$160 for shelving for the storage shed.

II. Boys' Season

A. Concession stand

1. Soccer Regionals 10/18 (5 & 7pm) and 10/21 (11am) – still need 3 volunteers per game.

Action: Janet Kramer to send email to JV parents asking for volunteers.

2. Super Sectionals – Monday, 10/30 at 6:30 – 3 volunteers needed for this, too.

Action: Debbie Jordan to contact parents for volunteers

3. **Concession stand closing** - It was suggested that the parents that close the concession stand count the profits at the end of the night as well as filling out a form noting which supplies are low, etc.
4. **Pizza** – pizza slices will be cut into 8 pieces vs 6 and the price will be reduced to \$2/each.
5. **A non-carbonated drink** will be added to the beverage choices.

B. Silent Auction – Kathy Steffen

1. **Location** – Gino's East in Lake Zurich
2. **Date** – TBD; any Sunday in November
3. **Terms** – free publicity in local newspaper and Daily Herald
 - \$25/person – receives 2 drink tickets, all you can eat pizza, salad and hors d'oeuvres
4. Kathy reviewed the Silent Auction held in 2004 where we made approximately \$4,300. Each team was responsible for contributing a basket which had pre-assigned themes. The team parent was responsible for coordinating. Examples given were "Parent's Night Out", "Dad's Dream Basket", "Teenage Dream Basket" and Mom's Dream Basket". Baskets are filled with either gift certificates, tickets to events, or actual products.
 - a. In addition to team baskets, the Silent Auction coordinators need help obtaining donations from other local businesses. There were approximately 50 different baskets in 2004.
 - b. Donations can be dropped off at Kathy Steffen's house.

Action: A date needs to be determined. Once we know the date, publicity for the event can be started as well as coordinating volunteers and baskets for the teams.

C. Senior Celebration – Kathy Guzak

1. This event will be held October 7th. There are 13 graduating seniors.
2. An engraved key chain will be presented to each senior player.

3. Patty Hair created 11x17 posters which were distributed around town. Each player received one free of charge and additional copies could be purchased for \$3.00/each.

D. Publicity – Patti Hair

1. Programs are created for each home varsity game which contain the visiting team roster as well as Lake Zurich's.
2. The Homecoming program will be the same format but will be decorated.
3. We're the only school in our league with this type of brochure, which is distributed free of charge.

E. Miscellaneous

1. Video – Tom Vogan and sophomores are taping and converting to VHS. These tapes can be provided to any parent upon request.
2. T-Shirt sales – we made \$50 in profit.
3. Web site volunteer – Debbie Petrou has offered to take care of our website.
